POLITICAL AND SECURITY AFFAIRS

TRADE, ECONOMIC, AND ENERGY AFFAIRS

Today, three key factors—the rise of China and India, the shifting balance of economic power, and Asia’s dramatic growth in energy demand—are increasingly influencing global markets, the environment, and geopolitics. NBR examines these issues by drawing on a global network of a specialists to convene high-level dialogues, and to conduct innovative research that results in actionable policy recommendations. Core initiatives include: Energy Security Program; China’s Strategies on IPR, Technology Standards, and Innovation; Pacific Energy Summit; and Maritime Energy Resources in Asia.

CENTER FOR HEALTH AND AGING

Through its publications and initiatives, the Center for Health and Aging (CHA) works to advance dialogue surrounding critical global health topics such as pandemics, nutrition, tuberculosis, and vaccines. CHA organizes the Pacific Health Summit, an annual Davos-level meeting that brings together global leaders from science, industry, and policy. Utilizing emerging science and technology, the goal of the Summit is to transform global healthcare through the prevention, early detection, and early treatment of disease.

Building on Senator Henry “Scoop” Jackson’s legacy, NBR engages in a demand-driven approach to reach out to Congress and cultivate relationships on both sides of the aisle.
