EMBASSY OF JAPAN MINISTER YASUSHI AKAHOSHI AND REP. CHARLES BOUSTANY, JR. TO KEYNOTE "ADAPTING TO A NEW ENERGY ERA"

WHAT: How can the United States, Japan, and other stakeholders in Asia work together to forge a new energy and security environment? On **Tuesday, February 24, 2015**, The National Bureau of Asian Research (NBR) will release the findings of NBR's two-year project "Adapting to a New Energy Era: A New Strategy for U.S., Japanese, and Asian Energy Security." The event will feature remarks by Minister Yasushi Akahoshi (Embassy of Japan in the United States), Rep. Charles Boustany, Jr. (R-LA), as well as panel discussions with senior policymakers, industry leaders, and top energy and geopolitical specialists.
