## Roy Kamphausen Appointed to U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission

The National Bureau of Asian Research (NBR) announces the appointment of Roy D. Kamphausen, Senior Vice President for Research at NBR, to the U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission (USCC). Mr. Kamphausen was appointed on April 9 by the Senate Majority Leader. The USCC was created by Congress in 2000 "to monitor, investigate, and submit to Congress an annual report on the national security implications of the bilateral trade and economic relationship between the United States and the People's Republic of China, and to provide recommendations, where appropriate, to Congress for legislative and administrative action." Mr. Kamphausen is the first USCC Commissioner appointed from NBR.

Mr. Kamphausen will continue to serve as NBR Senior Vice President for Research and Deputy Director of the Commission on the Theft of American Intellectual Property. He is an expert on U.S.-Asia issues, including China's People's Liberation Army, U.S.-China defense relations, East Asian security, innovation, and intellectual property protection. He has served as author, contributing author, or co-editor of numerous publications, including chapters in NBR's <u>Strategic Asia</u> series, the Carlisle <u>People's Liberation Army Conference</u> series, and the IP Commission's <u>Report on the Theft of</u>

<u>American Intellectual Property</u> and its <u>2017 Update</u>. He has presented on these topics throughout the United States, Asia, and Europe to government and corporate decision-makers. Mr. Kamphausen is frequently cited in U.S. and international media, including CNN, the *Financial Times*, *Foreign Policy*, National Public Radio, *Newsweek*, and the *New York Times*.

Prior to joining NBR, Mr. Kamphausen served as a career U.S. Army officer. As a China foreign area officer, his career included assignments as China policy director in the Office of the Secretary of Defense, China strategist for the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and a military attaché at the U.S. Embassy in Beijing. He holds a BA in Political Science from Wheaton College and an MA in International Affairs from Columbia University. He studied Chinese at both the Defense Language Institute and Beijing's Capital Normal University.

Mr. Kamphausen is an Adjunct Associate Professor at Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs and a Senior Adviser on East Asia for the University of Connecticut's Office of Global Affairs. He lectures regularly at leading U.S. military institutions, including the United States Military Academy (West Point) and the U.S. Army War College.
